



Comcast Cares Day is coming SRHS on Saturday, April 21, 2018

On Saturday, April 21st, Comcast California will be partnering with SRHS for a campus clean-up and beautification day, and you're invited to join us and pitch in! It's all part of our 17th annual Comcast Cares Day, the company's yearly day of service, when Comcast employees, families, and friends partner with local organizations nationwide on projects that benefit the communities where they live and work.

As you know, last fall the North Bay was hit with the worst fires in CA history. Comcast Cares Day gives Comcast an opportunity to give back and help with the rebuilding and recovery of a community that was so significantly impacted.

To show our commitment to the North Bay, Comcast is partnering with Santa Rosa City Schools to host two Comcast Cares Day projects to assist and aid the more than 800 families that lost their homes, and the greater community that was impacted by the fires: Lewis Campus (formerly Lewis Elementary School) and **Santa Rosa High School**. We are also hosting a third project of planting trees in the Fountain Grove II area.

Our projects at Santa Rosa High will focus on cleaning up the landscape in and around Nevers Field, by weeding and putting down fresh wood chips, trash pickup and general cleaning.

We will start our day at the school-side entrance to Nevers Field at **7:30am** with registration and a continental breakfast. A short Welcome will commence around 8:00am, with work beginning right after. Later in the day, we'll ask you to join the rest of our volunteers at the Lewis Campus for a special luncheon and presentation.

For planning purposes, we ask that you sign up by Wednesday, April 18th – although we won't turn you away if you don't, it just helps us ensure we have enough of everything for everyone!
